### SEC CHAMPION CATS CELEBRATE SENIOR DAY

After clinching a share of its 44th SEC Championship on Wednesday against Georgia, the Wildcats go for the title outright on Senior Day Sunday against Florida.

The Cats claimed the title after an 80-68 win at Georgia led by Patrick Patterson and John Wall.

Patterson poured in 17 points and pulled down 10 rebounds for his ninth double-double of the season. He also blocked four shots for the second time in three games.

Wall led all scorers with 24 points to go along with six assists and three steals, game-highs in both categories.

Darnell Dodson also scored in double-figures with 11 points, including three three-pointers.

### CAT SCRATCHES

- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA wins leader with 2,016 victories.
- John Calipari is one of two coaches (Frank McGuire) in NCAA history to lead three top-ranked teams.
- Calipari has guided his teams to 11 conference titles.
- UK's 13 conference wins are the most since 14 in the 2005 season.
- Kentucky clinched a share of its 44th SEC Championship and can win the title outright with a win over Florida. UK is the East Division top seed in the SEC Tournament in Nashville, Tenn. and will open play on Friday at Noon CT.
- DeMarcus Cousins has recorded a UK freshman record 18 double-doubles, the most by a Wildcat since Jim Andrews recorded 21 in the 1973 season.
- John Wall has recorded a UK freshman record 179 assists.
- UK aims to break its all-time attendance record on Sunday for average and total attendance. Kentucky is currently averaging 24,096 fans and has totaled 409, 635. The records are 24,025 and 422,547.
- UK defeated Florida earlier this season, 89-77 in Gainesville to run its all-time record against the Gators to 87-32. The Wildcats are 44-8 against Florida all-time in Lexington.
- The Wildcats look to sweep the Gators for the first time since the 2004 season.

### CATS RAISE OVER \$1 MILLION IN HOOPS FOR HAITI

With the efforts of Calipari, WKYT, UK coaches and players (current and former), local and national celebrities, the collegiate coaching community, local and national businessmen across the country, and more, UK raised \$525,000 in funds in its "Hoops for Haiti" telethon, a four-and-a-half fundraiser to help the relief efforts in Haiti. With \$500,000 in matching funds, UK raised more than \$1 million.

Through the United Way and the American Red Cross, the donations will go straight to the relief efforts in Haiti.

### JOHN WALL NAMED A BOB COUSY FINALIST

UK men's basketball freshman John Wall was named a Bob Cousy Award top five finalist as announced by The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.

The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. 72 candidates were nominated for the 2010 award. Nominations were solicited from all Division I, II and III schools across the country.

This original list of candidates was narrowed down to a final 20 on January 1st, and then to the final 10 by February 1st, and final five by March 1st. The winner of the 2010 Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday, April 5th in Indianapolis as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

### HOME SWEET HOME

The Wildcats currently sit at 17-0 at home, one shy of the Rupp Arena record 18-0 mark posted by the 1986 squad.

The last time UK went undefeated at home was in the 2000 season when they went 14-0.

### HOME SWEET HOME II

There's no question Kentuckians love their basketball and the numbers at Rupp Arena show it.

UK's current attendance average is 24,096 fans

per game, 71 more than the 1991 average of 24,025 which is the current record.

This season's total attendance is 409,635, which is quickly closing in on last season's record of 422,547.

Kentucky has posted three attendance marks this season which currently rank in top 10 largest crowds in Rupp Arena history.

### SENIOR SALUTE

In a time-honored pregame ceremony, Kentucky will honor its seniors - Ramon Harris, Mark Krebs and Perry Stevenson - on Senior Day. The ceremony will include video tributes, over 23,000 fans singing "My Old Kentucky Home" and the presentation of framed jerseys.

The ceremony, which the late Al McGuire once called "the most touching moment in all of sports," will begin at approximately 11:45 a.m.

### SENIOR DAY SUPREMACY

The Wildcats have been highly successful in their Senior Day games over the years. Since 1920, Kentucky is 83-6, winning 10 of the last 11 and 42 of the last 45.

### UK HONORS PATTERSON

In addition to Sunday's Senior Day ceremonies, the Wildcats will be honoring junior Patrick Patterson as well.

Patterson will earn his degree in Communications in just three years.

He's a member of the Wildcats' exclusive 1,000-point club, becoming the 10th fastest member. He currently ranks 17th.

### SEC LEGEND

Former UK head coach Joe B. Hall has been named Kentucky's SEC legend for this year's SEC Tournament.

Hall, who grew up just 20 minutes north of the University of Kentucky campus in Cynthiana, had the unenviable task of following the legendary Adolph Rupp. But Hall, the former Rupp assistant, met the challenge head on, coaching three teams to the Final Four (1975, '78 and '84) and

John Calipari already counted himself among the coaching elite in terms of coaching wins in the first 17 years of his career. Just a few games into the 2009-10 season — his 18th season as a head coach — he is already in the top five for most wins by an NCAA Division I coach in his first 18 years.

winning the 1978 NCAA Championship, the school's fifth title and first in 20 seasons.

Hall began his association with Kentucky as a student-athlete during the "Fabulous Five era." He played one year of junior varsity and one year of varsity basketball before transferring to the University of the South in Seawane, Tenn., where he finished his eligibility and set a single-game scoring record. Following his college career, Hall toured Europe with the Harlem Globetrotters in 1951, but later returned to UK and completed his degree requirements.

His coaching career began at Shepherdsville (Ky.) High School in 1956. It continued on to Regis College in Denver, where he spent five years (57-50 record), and Central Missouri State, where he recorded a 19-6 mark in one season before returning to UK as an assistant to Rupp on July 1, 1965.

As the UK head coach, Hall won National Coach of the Year honors in 1978 and four SEC Coach of the Year awards. He had seven players win All-America honors 11 times and nine Wildcats were voted All-SEC on 18 occasions.

## CATS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the first time since the 2002 season, the Wildcats could be found in the Associated Press top five, checking in at No. 4.

The Wildcats were selected fifth in the USA Today/Coaches' Pre-Season top 25.

Kentucky currently sits in third the AP Top 25 and third in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

## CATS RANK NATIONALLY IN NCAA STATS

The Wildcats' success this season is showing up in the NCAA statistical ranking.

Junior Patrick Patterson has picked up where he left off last season in field goal percentage. Patterson finished last season ranked 11th and currently ranks ninth with a 58.8 percentage.

Freshman John Wall ranks fifth nationally in assists (6.2) and 56th in steals (1.9). He also ranks fourth among freshman nationally in scoring (17.0).

Freshman DeMarcus Cousins continues his climb up the national stats ladder. He ranks fifth nationally with 18 double-doubles (first among freshmen), 18th in rebounding and second among freshmen (10.1), 27th in field goal pct. (54.5) and tied for 62nd in blocks (1.8). Cousins also ranks sixth in scoring (15.9) among freshmen and third in field goal percentage.

## 20-WIN SEASONS

With its first win over Vanderbilt, Kentucky recorded its 20th win this season. The Wildcats have tallied 54 20-win seasons and second straight.

UK's 28 wins is the most since the 2005 team recorded 28 wins.

## INCREASE IN MINUTES

In the early part of the season, DeMarcus Cousins was often saddled with foul trouble, resulting in fewer minutes.

Through the first 14 games of the season, the freshman forward averaged 18.7 minutes per game.

However, over the last 16 games, Cousins has seen his minutes increase to 26.7 per contest.

Furthermore, if Cousins were to play 40 minutes, he would be averaging 27.6 points and 17.6 rebounds per game.

## COUSINS' COMPLETE GAMES

Foul trouble followed freshman DeMarcus Cousins around at the beginning of the season. He has recorded two or more fouls in the first half 19 times, resulting in fewer first half minutes.

However, Cousins makes the most of his second half time, averaging 8.8 points and 5.2 rebounds in the second frame.

He has posted one second half double-double and has come within one or two rebounds of a double-double twice.

## WALL MAKES HISTORY, AGAIN

Freshman John Wall continues to rewrite the Kentucky record book. Wall became the first player in UK history to record a double-double in points and assists as well as points and rebounds.

## UNDEFEATED CAL

For third time in his career, Coach Calipari's was the nation's last undefeated team.

Cal's 1996 UMass squad was the nation's lone undefeated team at 26-0. They didn't drop their first game until Jan. 22, 1996.

In 2008, Memphis was the last undefeated team at 26-0. They didn't drop their first game until Feb. 20.

At 19-0, the Wildcats were the country's last team without a blemish.

## CATS STREAKING UNDER CALIPARI

Coach Cal and the Wildcats jumped out to their best start since the 1966 season when UK opened 19-0. Kentucky's 19-game winning streak was the sixth such streak in Calipari's career and his seventh 15-game or better winning streak.

## CAL UNRIVALED IN THE CONFERENCE

UK head coach John Calipari is unrivaled in the league when it comes conference accolades. During his career, Calipari has won 11 league championships, including the 2010 SEC Championship, seven more than the next closest coach (Mark Fox has four WAC championships).

Coach Cal also has nine conference tournament titles, six more than his closest competitor.

## CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP CAL

Calipari has now won five straight conference championships, dating back to his Conference USA days. He has also won five conference championships in the last six years.

## CAL REACHES ANOTHER FIRST

UK head coach John Calipari became the first UK head coach since Eddie Sutton in 1985 to defeat Louisville in his first game.

## CALIPARI IN CONFERENCE

Coach Calipari has tasted success in his non-conference schedule, but his conference resume is just as impressive. Prior to the loss at South Carolina, Cal posted a 65-game conference winning streak.

The Arkansas win extended Calipari's conference regular-season win streak to 54-consecutive games, an NCAA record for longest regular-season conference win streak. With UK's win over Auburn, he passed Adolph Rupp, who posted a win streak of 52 from 1950-54.

Calipari also won an NCAA record 65-straight games versus league opponents, including conference tournaments. Rupp held the record with 64 straight wins in the SEC (including the SEC Tournament) from 1945 to 1950.

## CAL WINS 20 IN FIRST UK SEASON

With the win over Vanderbilt, the Wildcats claimed their 54th all-time 20-win season. Coach Calipari became just the fourth UK head coach to tally 20 wins in his inaugural season.

## CAL AMONG THE LEGENDS

In addition to all the success he's already enjoyed, coach John Calipari is now writing his name among the legends.

Calipari is one of only two coaches (Frank McGuire-St. John's [No. 1], North Carolina [No. 1], South Carolina [No. 1]) in NCAA history to lead three teams to a No. 1 ranking. He led UMass to a No. 1 ranking in 1995 and 1996 and he led Memphis to the No. 1 spot in the 2008 season.

## CALIPARI'S TEAMS TOUGH AT THE TOP

When teams are ranked in the top five, they become huge targets for all opponents they play. That has been true for John Calipari-coached teams at his last three stops. But, while some top-ranked teams fall easily, Calipari squads have done quite well, and in turn, have had staying power near the top of the polls.

Calipari's Kentucky, Memphis and UMass teams have an impressive combined record of 164-15 (.916) when ranked in the top five of the Associated Press.

Kentucky is 28-2 when ranked in the top five under Calipari. At Memphis, Calipari's teams were 81-7 when ranked in the top five. During his time at UMass, the Minutemen went 55-6 when ranked in the top five. The following shows Calipari's record when ranked at or near the top:

## CAL JUST AS COMFORTABLE ON THE ROAD

Calipari has recorded a 46-6 record on the road dating back to 2005-06 season. The Wildcats are 6-2 in true road games this season.

## PASSING RUPP

UK head coach John Calipari jumped out to a 19-0 start before his first loss in his inaugural season at Kentucky. His 19 straight wins to start his UK career is something to be proud of, as it marks the best start by a Kentucky coach in UK history. Calipari passed Adolph Rupp's 10-game winning streak to begin his career at Kentucky in 1931.

Rupp won 10 games before collecting his first loss. Joe B. Hall won his first game before dropping his first game. Eddie Sutton then won his first five games before losing at Kansas. Rick Pitino won a game before dropping his first game, while Tubby Smith won two before losing his first game. Billy Gillispie also won one game before dropping his first game.

## SCOUTING FLORIDA

Located in Gainesville, Fla. (717 miles south of Lexington), Florida is in the SEC East division.

The Gators enter the game after dropping a 64-60 affair on Senior Day to Vanderbilt Tuesday.

Florida has five players averaging double-figures led by freshman Kenny Boynton's 13.5. Joining Boynton are Erving Walker (12.7), Chandler Parsons (12.0), Alex Tyus (11.8) and Vernon Macklin (10.7).

Tyus leads the Gators in rebounding at 7.0

The Gators are coached by Billy Donovan, who is 365-156 (.701) including a 330-136 (.708) mark at Florida. Donovan's 22 NCAA tournament victories at Florida more than triples the number of NCAA Tournament games UF had won in school history prior to his arrival.

Prior to his stop in Gainesville, Donovan served as an assistant coach at UK from 1990-94. He was head coach at Marshall from 1995-96.

### SERIES HISTORY

Kentucky owns an 87-32 (.731) record in the all-time series, including a 44-8 (.846) mark in Lexington.

After defeating Florida 89-77 earlier this season in Gainesville, Kentucky is looking for its first regular season sweep of the Gators since the 2004 season.

The Gators have won eight of the last 11 meetings, due in large part to a seven-game winning streak that stretched from the 2005 to the 2008 seasons.

### SUNSHINE SUCCESS

Kentucky is 101-36 (.737) all-time against schools from the Sunshine State. Most of the action has come against the Gators (87-32, .731).

### KENTUCKY-FLORIDA CONNECTIONS

- Florida head coach Billy Donovan was on former UK coach Rick Pitino's staff in Lexington from 1990-1994. Donovan served as a graduate assistant coach in '90 before being promoted to assistant coach from 1991-93 and an associate head coach in '94. He is 11-16 all-time against UK.

### UK VS. THE SEC EAST

Kentucky is 519-175 (.748) against schools comprising the SEC's Eastern division. Since the Southeastern Conference split into two divisions against in 1992, the Wildcats have gone 156-50 (.757) against SEC East teams.

The Wildcats are 7-2 against the East this season, including a win over Florida and a season sweep of Vanderbilt and Georgia, while splitting the season series with South Carolina and Tennessee.

### SEC DOMINATION

Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording an 874-242 mark (.783). Only one other team has won more than 690 regular season SEC games (Alabama) and no other team has a better winning percentage. UK has averaged 11.5 wins and only 3.2 losses per season in 75 seasons in the SEC.

- The Wildcats have won 44 SEC titles and 25 SEC Tournament Championships, more than the other 11 teams combined.

- Kentucky has won 10 of the last 18 SEC Tournament titles.

- UK has won 12 SEC East titles in the 19 seasons since the league expanded.

### UK VS. THE COUNTRY

Kentucky has played 204 of the current 347 D1 programs.

### ROOKIE REPORT

The Wildcats' number one recruiting class has been living up to expectations all season.

The newcomers have led the Cats in scoring in all but four games and blocked shots in all but two games and have led the team in assists every game.

### FRESHMEN RECORD BOOK

Midway through the season and the UK freshmen record book has been rewritten several times.

It began with Eric Bledsoe who tallied 24 points in his season debut, the most by a UK freshman in a season opener.

John Wall set a UK freshman record for assists in a game with 14 against UNC Asheville, he then topped that with a school record breaking 16 assists against Hartford. He also recorded the third most steals by a freshman with six against UNC Asheville and UConn.

Wall broke the UK freshman season assist record formerly held by Dirk Minniefield (126 in 1980 season) and currently has 179.

DeMarcus Cousins recorded the second most rebounds for a UK freshman when he pulled down 18 against Sam Houston State and again against Louisville.

Cousins has also recorded 18 double-doubles setting the UK freshman record for that stat.

Together the three have scored 25 points in a game during the season making them the first freshmen trio to do so since 1975 (Givens, Robey and Phillips).

### UK STANDS OUT IN SEC

Kentucky is the only school in the SEC to have three players rank in the top 15 in scoring in the league and two players in the top five in rebounding. The Wildcats are represented by John Wall (4th - 17.0), DeMarcus Cousins (7th - 15.9) and Patrick Patterson (12th - 15.0), while Cousins ranks second in rebounds, averaging 10.1 rpg and Patterson ranks fifth with 7.6 rpg.

As a team, the Wildcats lead the league in scoring (79.9), scoring margin (+14.4), field goal pct. (.478), rebounding offense (41.9), rebounding margin (+9.1), assists (14.9), offensive rebounds (14.7) and offensive rebounding percentage (41.9).

Individually, Patterson has a league best in field goal pct. (.588). Wall tops the SEC in assists (6.2) and Cousins leads the lead in offensive rebounds (4.3).

### ASSIST BY JOHN WALL

Freshman John Wall is looking to rewrite the record books when it comes to assists.

The young Wildcat already has three double-digit assist games. He broke Travis Ford's 16-year old school record for assists with 16 against Hartford.

He's currently averaging 6.2 and with one regular season game and at least two postseason games left that translates to 198 assists by season's end. With at least three games remaining, he's already set the UK freshman record for assists in a season with 179.

### 1,000 POINT CLUB

Kentucky junior Patrick Patterson joined the prestigious 1,000 point club at UK last season. This year, he continues to move up the ladder on Kentucky's all-time scoring list.

Patterson currently ranks 17th with 1,469 points.

### WILDCATS DOUBLE UP

DeMarcus Cousins has tallied 18 double-doubles so far this season, which leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally.

Cousins recorded seven straight double-doubles, the first Wildcat to do so since Jim Andrews in the

1973 season.

With his double-double against Vandy, he broke the UK freshman record for doubles in a season.

Patrick Patterson has recorded nine double-doubles and currently has 30 career double-doubles which ranks second for the most among active SEC players and ties for sixth in UK history.

John Wall has four double-doubles, two in points and assists and two in points and rebounds. He became the first Wildcat in UK history to record both types of double-doubles and the first Wildcat to record a double-double in assists since Cliff Hawkins in the 2004 season.

### UK WINNING IN UNFRIENDLY CONFINES

Kentucky's win at Indiana marked the second-straight game the Wildcats were able to break a winless streak in an arena other than their own.

Before beating the Hoosiers in Assembly Hall, the Cats hadn't won there since the 1980-81 season.

UK's win over Connecticut at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 9 was the program's first victory in that venue since 1995.

And while UK's streak in the O'Connell Center stretched back to only 2004, the Wildcats broke a five-year drought on the Florida Gators' home floor.

Additionally, UK picked up its first win in Memorial Gym over Vanderbilt since the 2005 season.

### NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Kentucky has 15 games on CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 this year. The Wildcats appear on ESPN/ESPN2 10 times and a total of 13 times on the ESPN Family of Networks (including ESPNU).

The Wildcats are on CBS five times.

### THREE MANIA

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 741 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt.

The Wildcats' last game without a three-pointer came 19 seasons ago against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a three-pointer in every game since the three-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. Through March 3, the Rebels' streak is 766 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 757 games.

### PERFECT ATTENDANCE

The Wildcats set their third attendance record of the season against Louisville, breaking the Rupp Arena record for the second time in less than a month. 24,479 fans watched the Cats post a 71-62 win over the Cardinals, breaking the record set earlier in the season against North Carolina. UK announced a then-Rupp Arena record 24,468 in UK's 68-66 win over the Tar Heels.

In Kentucky's home-opener, the Wildcats announced 24,338, a record for home-openers in Rupp Arena.

UK announced 24,354 in its 2,000th win over Drexel. At the time it was the 11th largest crowd in Rupp Arena history.

### CATS ROCK AT RUPP ARENA

- UK has won 102 of its last 125 home games. The Cats are 17-0 at home this season. The Wildcats are 444-60 (.881) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- UK has won 20 national attendance titles in the building, including 13 of the last 14.
- The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,479 was set in 2010 against Louisville on Jan. 2.
- The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 246-38 (.866) record in regular season SEC games played in Rupp.

## PATTERSON NAMED AP ALL-AMERICA

Junior Patrick Patterson was named first team Associated Press Preseason All-America. He is the first Wildcat to receive such an honor since Tayshaun Prince at the beginning of the 2001-02 season.

## PATTERSON, WALL ON NAISMITH WATCH LIST

Patrick Patterson and freshman John Wall were both named to the Naismith Preseason Watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club.

Patterson, a pre-season All-American is making his second straight appearance on the Naismith watch list.

Wall is one of five freshmen on the watch list. A pre-season All-American according to several national publications, Wall was the top recruit in the country last season according to Rivals.com.

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2009-10 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2010 NCAA Men's Final Four in Indianapolis, Ind.

## PATTERSON, WALL NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Kentucky junior Patrick Patterson was the choice of the media for SEC Men's Basketball Player of the Year with 11 votes. Kentucky freshman John Wall (six votes), Mississippi State senior Jarvis Varnado (three votes), South Carolina senior Devan Downey (three votes) and Tennessee senior Tyler Smith (two votes) also received votes in the Player of the Year voting.

Patterson, Downey, Varnado and Smith were joined on the All-SEC First Team by Ole Miss sophomore Terrico White.

Wall led All-SEC Second Team honors and was joined by LSU's Tasmin Mitchell, Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy, Ole Miss' Chris Warren and Auburn's DeWayne Reed.

## UK PREDICTED TO WIN SEC CHAMPIONSHIP

Kentucky earned 20 first-place votes, topping Mississippi State which earned three votes and Tennessee which had two votes as SEC Champion.

The Cats were the media's favorite to win the East with 148 total points (23 first-place votes), ahead of second-place Tennessee's 117 points (two first-place votes). Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Florida and Georgia round out the top six.

## SEASON NOTES

### STACEY POOLE JR. SIGNS WITH UK

Stacey Poole, Jr. signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball at the University of Kentucky.

A senior at Providence High School in Jacksonville, Fla., Poole is ranked the fourth best small forward (27th overall) by Rivals.com recruiting service and the 11th best small forward (58th overall) by Scout.com.

The 6-foot-5, 190-pound Poole, a first-team

All-First Coast selection last season, averaged 17.3 points per game his junior season at Jackson High School.

He is the son of former University of Florida standout Stacey Poole, who still ranks as the Gators' No. 4 all-time scorer with 1,678 points.

Poole is the first signee for the Wildcats of the 2010 class.

## PATTERSON, WALL NAMED TOP 30 WOODEN CANDIDATES

Patrick Patterson and John Wall were both named Top 30 candidates for the John R. Wooden award.

Wall is one of 10 players on the list that was not on the original watch list released in the preseason.

Just as players who are not on the preseason list are eligible for the Midseason Top 30, players who do not make the Midseason list are still eligible for the national ballot, which will be selected in March and will consist of approximately 20 players, chosen by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board Committee.

More than 1,000 voters, comprised of sports media members and college basketball experts from across the nation, will then cast their votes to determine both the 10-member All American Team and Player of the Year. In late March, the 10-player Wooden Award All American Team will be announced.

## WILDCATS RECEIVE MID-SEASON HONORS

ESPN's Dick Vitale named UK head coach John Calipari his mid-season Coach of the Year and called John Wall his Player of the Year.

At the mid-way point, Calipari had led the Wildcats to a 17-0 (2-0 in SEC) record to open the season, Kentucky's best start since the 1966 team started off 23-0. Wall led the Cats in scoring at 17.3 points and ranked second nationally in assists at 7.1 per game.

ESPN's Jay Bilas named Wall a mid-season All-America first teamer.

He also named Calipari as his mid-season Coach of the Year.

The Sporting News' Mike DeCourcy also selected Wall as his mid-season Player of the Year.

DeCourcy also called Eric Bledsoe the nation's most surprising player.

## WALL SETS ASSIST RECORD

The legend of John Wall has grown exponentially since his arrival in Lexington. He added another notch against Hartford, breaking the 16-year school record for assists in a game.

Wall handed out 16 assists (11 in the first half), topping Travis Ford's 15 'dimes' against Eastern Kentucky in the 1994 season.

## CANCUN CHALLENGE CHAMPIONS

The Wildcats claimed their second straight in-season tournament championship with a 73-65 overtime win over Stanford in Cancun Challenge championship game.

UK won both of its first round games in Lexington with wins over Sam Houston State (102-

92) and Rider (92-63), then traveled to Cancun and defeated Cleveland State (73-45) and Stanford for the championship.

Freshman John Wall was named the tournament MVP while fellow freshman DeMarcus Cousins was also named all-tournament.

## ATTENDANCE RECORD

A record crowd of 24,338 showed up for the 2010 season opener and the start of the John Calipari era. The previous season-opening record crowd was 24,327 against Louisville in 1993.

It was also the 11th largest crowd in Rupp Arena history.

## BIG BLUE MANIA

### "SUPER FAN" IN 57TH SEASON

UK fan Bob Wiggins, 81, continued his amazing streak of following the basketball Cats. The 2009-10 season is his 57th watching Kentucky in person and through his own record-keeping, he has attended 1,434 UK games.

His home-court streak spans 48 years and 712 games. During that period, which dates back to 1960-61, UK has a home record of 627-85 (.881).

U-S-A, U-S-A, U-S-A!!

The UK basketball program has always had strong ties with the United States Basketball program. Joining the likes of the 1948 Olympic Gold medalist Wildcats, and the most recent gold medal winning Wildcat, Tayshaun Prince, is Darius Miller.

The 6-7 sophomore was selected to the U19 US national team who helped lead to the U19 World Championship.

Miller led the team with 12 blocked shots in nine games, while averaging 5.0 ppg and 3.1 rpg.

Also representing the US during the offseason were newcomers DeMarcus Cousins and John Wall. Both played for the 2009 USA Nike Hoop Summit Team that went up against the World Select Team, suffering a 97-89 loss. Wall finished the game with 13 points, 11 assists and five steals, while Cousins tallied four points and five rebounds.

### Social Networking

UK head coach John Calipari has wasted no time embracing his social responsibilities as basketball coach. Within a few weeks of taking the job, Calipari joined the popular networking tool Twitter and now has over 1.2 million followers.

He has also created his own Facebook page, as well as launching his own website, CoachCal.com.

### West Coast Cats

While most of their teammates spent the summer taking summer classes or playing pick-up games in Lexington, Patrick Patterson and Daniel Orton spent their time in California for two months training for the upcoming season.

The two big men enlisted in a camp designed to improve basketball skills, while at the same time increasing their strengt and stamina.

### The King Visits Camelot

The King finally visited Camelot.

College basketball's greatest tradition and basketball's most visible star came together in August afternoon at Kentucky's campus. LeBron James, the 2009 NBA MVP, flew into Lexington to tour UK's basketball facilities.

King James and Kentucky have long been viewed as two of the most iconic figures and programs in basketball for some time, but Friday was the first time the two had come together. Even though James never attended UK or college for that matter - he was the No. 1 pick in the 2003 NBA Draft - UK head coach John Calipari and James have had a budding friendship re-

cently.

When Calipari heard James was interested in touring UK's basketball facilities on his way to an event in Mississippi, Calipari and his staff set up a mock recruiting visit.

### Wildcats Earn APR Award

The University of Kentucky men's basketball team received the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) awarded for its APR score.

UK receives the award for placing in the top 10 percent of the nation's Division I men's basketball APR scores. The APR marks are a four-year composite, covering the 2004-05, 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08 school years, that measures academic eligibility and retention of student-athletes.

UK was the only men's basketball team in the Southeastern Conference to receive a public recognition award.

### Rondo Is an All-Star

Former Wildcat stand-out and current Boston Celtic was voted to his first NBA All-Star team this season.

At the time of the selection, Rondo had started every game for the Celtics and was nearly averaging a double-double at 14.1 ppg and 9.6 apg.

## JOHN CALIPARI FILE



After bringing the University of Massachusetts basketball program to national prominence in the '90s and resurrecting the Memphis basketball program in the 2000s, John Calipari became the 22nd coach in UK history, and the seventh in the last 79 years.

In 1996, Calipari moved from UMass to the NBA after leading the Minutemen to the Final Four. For his efforts, Calipari was named Naismith National Coach of the Year.

Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, and Memphis' 38 wins in 2007-08

made him the winningest coach for a single season in NCAA history. As a result, Calipari was named Naismith National Coach of the Year for a second time in his career. He is only the second coach to receive the honor multiple times since the award's inception in 1987. Duke's Mike Krzyzewski is the other to do so.

Calipari, the 2009 *Sports Illustrated* National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine-straight 20-win campaigns and nine-consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 wins — 28 wins per season — as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history.

Calipari's success began in his first season at Memphis, but it was the last four years that placed him in the NCAA and school record books. The Tigers' 137 wins the last four seasons made Calipari the winningest coach in a four-year span in NCAA Division I history. His 104 victories in the last three seasons are the second-most in NCAA Division I history over a three-year span.

He directed the Tigers to the top of both national polls in 2007-08, becoming the fifth coach in NCAA Division I history to take two different schools to the No. 1 ranking. Calipari led UMass to No. 1 in 1996. He joined Roy Williams, Ralph Miller, Frank McGuire and Eddie Sutton in that elite club.

The last four seasons, Calipari directed the Tigers to four-straight 30-win campaigns and is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record four-straight 30-win ledgers.

With his success at Memphis, Calipari's overall record soared to 445-140 for an impressive 76.1 winning percentage. His 445 wins are the second-most in NCAA Division I history in the first 17 years, Roy Williams being the other.

Calipari's 76.1 winning percentage is the third-highest among active NCAA Division I coaches with 10 years experience at college basketball's Division I level, trailing only Roy Williams and Mark Few. On the NCAA Division I list for winning percentage for all coaches (minimum 10 years), Calipari is in 14th place and ahead of Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins and Lute Olson.

With his four 30-win seasons at Memphis, Calipari now has six for his career, which is the fourth-most for a head coach in NCAA Division I history. For his career (16 years), Calipari has 15 20-win seasons and nine 25-win campaigns.

Much like he did at UMass, when his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari did the same at Memphis. Fifteen of the last 18 seniors that came through the Tiger program have earned their bachelor's degrees and the three seniors this season are on schedule to graduate in the spring of 2009.

Calipari compiled a 193-71 record (.731) during his eight-year career at Massachusetts, including a 108-44 mark (.684) in Atlantic 10 play. In addition to five-straight NCAA Tournaments, UMass also made two appearances in the NIT, advancing to the NIT final four in 1991. The 1990-91 season was the first of six-straight seasons in which the Minutemen won at least 20 games.

Calipari's personal 20-win streak has reached the 15-season mark as all of his Memphis clubs won 20-plus games. In his final season at UMass, Cali-

pari was named the 1996 Naismith National Coach of the Year and *The Sporting News* National Coach of the Year. He was also named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time in four years, as well as *Basketball Times* East Region Coach of the Year.

During the Minutemen's 35-2 season in 1995-96, UMass posted wins over Kentucky, Maryland, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Louisville. UMass ended the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation in the final regular season poll after being the top-ranked team for nine weeks earlier in the year. The Minutemen also won their first 26 games of the season, setting a school record for most consecutive wins.

In addition to his National Coach of the Year honors in 1996, Calipari was a Naismith Coach of the Year finalist in 1994 and 1995. He was the USBWA District I Coach of the Year in 1993.

At 29, when he was named head coach, Calipari began to build a program from the ground up, going 10-18 his first season before posting a 17-14 record his second year (receiving a bid to the NIT).

The Minutemen won their first A-10 championship in 1992 with a 30-5 record, including a 13-3 mark in league play. With a 77-71 overtime win over Syracuse in an East Regional second-round game, UMass made its first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

Calipari left UMass in June of 1996 to become Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations and Head Coach of the New Jersey Nets. He led the Nets to a second-place finish in the NBA's Atlantic Division and the playoffs in 1998, ending a five-year postseason drought for the franchise. The Nets' 17-game turnaround from the previous year was the best that season in the NBA.

He became a member of the Philadelphia 76ers coaching staff in 1999, rejoining Philadelphia coach Larry Brown, for whom Calipari was an assistant at Kansas.

Calipari began his coaching career at Kansas as a volunteer assistant under Ted Owens. In 1983, he was hired as the recruiting coordinator at the University of Vermont, but was swayed back to the nation's heartland when Brown was hired as head coach at KU. He spent three seasons at Kansas (1982-85) before another three-year stint as an assistant coach to Paul Evans at Pittsburgh (1985-88).

The 50-year-old lettered two years at North Carolina-Wilmington before transferring to Clarion State. He played point guard at Clarion during the 1981 and 1982 seasons, leading the team in assists and free throw percentage. The Eagles were ranked in the Division II Top 20 both years and participated in the 1981 NCAA Division II Tournament.

Calipari and his wife, Ellen, have two daughters, Erin Sue and Megan Rae, and a 13-year-old son, Bradley Vincent. Erin recently graduated from UMass and is now in her first year of grad school at Wake Forest, while Megan is a sophomore at UK.

### Cal Tid-Bits

- Since the 2005-06 season, Coach Calipari is 33-5 in March.
- Won 55 of last 57 regular season games, dating back to Dec. 22, 2008. Prior to his two losses this season, his last loss in a regular season game came on Dec. 20, 2008 vs. Syracuse.
- Has recorded a 46-6 record on the road dating back to 2005-06 season.
- Since taking over at Memphis in 2000, Calipari teams have posted a 171-19 record in home games.
- Conference regular-season win streak of 54-consecutive games, broke the longest regular-season conference win streak of by Adolph Rupp from 1950-54.
- Won 65 straight games versus league opponents, including conference tournaments. Adolph Rupp held the record with 64 straight wins in the SEC (including the SEC Tournament) from 1945 to 1950.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Kentucky freshman Eric Bledsoe scored 24 points while starting in place of John Wall, and the fourth-ranked Wildcats opened the John Calipari era with a 75-59 win over Morehead State on Friday night.

Patrick Patterson added 20 points - including his first career 3-pointer - to go with 12 rebounds, and Darnell Dodson scored 15 points as Kentucky (1-0) pulled away in the second half.

Kenneth Faried led Morehead State (0-1) with 17 points, but the defending Ohio Valley Conference champions couldn't keep up even with Wall sitting on the bench.

The Wildcats turned it over 24 times, made just four of 19 3-pointers and seemed to be indecisive while trying to decide whether to take an open shot or get to the basket.

Kentucky led 33-25 at the half and as the Wildcats slogged their way through the opening minutes of the second, the Eagles appeared to flirt - albeit briefly - with pulling a big upset at Rupp.

Calipari was brought in to return the blue bloods to greatness, and although he said before the game he wouldn't be surprised if the Wildcats opened 0-5, there was little doubt how much his first night as the coach of college basketball's all-time winningest program meant.

He stomped, he pleaded, he cajoled. He called a 30-second timeout after Faried dunked to pull the Eagles within 52-39 with about 9 minutes left, and slammed his fist a couple of times while urging his team to go play ball.

Bledsoe, almost an afterthought given all the hype surrounding the supremely talented Wall, wasted little time proving there's more than one freshman guard on the team who can be a blur when the ball is in his hands.

During one sequence Bledsoe fed a streaking Patterson for a lay-up, then followed a few moments later with a breathtaking coast-to-coast dash for another easy basket.

His best moment came later, when he knifed into the lane, absorbed contact and flipped the ball over his head with his back to the basket. The ball bounced off the rim several times before falling through the net.

The sellout crowd roared its approval, and Bledsoe kept them on their feet with another assist to Patterson on Kentucky's next possession. He later hit a fadeaway from 17 feet while falling on his backside, one of his few missteps.

Bledsoe walked off the floor to a standing ovation with 1:41 left and received some love from Wall. The two are expected to play alongside each other when the Wildcats play the RedHawks on Monday, part of a lineup that did little to dampen the high expectations set out by one of the country's most demanding fan bases.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Kentucky coach John Calipari looked up at the clock after Miami of Ohio tied the fourth-ranked Wildcats with six seconds left and wondered if he should call timeout.

John Wall didn't give him a chance.

The heralded Kentucky freshman quickly grabbed the inbounds pass, raced by his coach in a blur and pulled up from 15 feet.

Before Calipari could collect his thoughts, Wall's jumper was through the net to give the Wildcats a 72-70 win Monday night and Kentucky's newest superstar was running down the floor pounding his chest in joy.

Wall finished with 19 points and five rebounds in his highly anticipated debut as the Wildcats (2-0) escaped the RedHawks (0-2).

He proved to be worth the wait. Wall's heroics prevented Miami from joining Gardner-Webb and Virginia Military Institute as November giant killers at Rupp Arena.

After the RedHawks took an 18-point lead in the first half. The only person who didn't seem to panic was Calipari, who said he wanted his talented but inexperienced team to be tested early in the year.

It didn't exactly seem like it after Miami's Kenny Hayes hit a 3-pointer to tie the game at 70. Yet Wall's heroics spoiled Miami's bid for an upset, not that it seemed to bother coach Charlie Coles.

One that wasn't quite enough to pull off another early season stunner at Rupp.

Wall got plenty of help in the second half as Kentucky used its size to overcome shoddy ballhandling and questionable shot selection.

Patrick Patterson had 17 points and 10 rebounds and DeMarcus Cousins had 10 points and 10 boards for Kentucky, which outrebounded Miami 37-25 and outscored the RedHawks 32-12 in the paint.

Nick Winbush led Miami with 26 points and the RedHawks nearly pulled off the upset thanks to making 15 of 26 3-pointers.

Wall wasn't perfect - he turned it over five times - but he looked at ease with the ball in his hands and hardly bothered with the hype surrounding his arrival.

He didn't waste any time getting comfortable, he drilled his first shot, a 3-pointer from the top of the key, to give Kentucky an early 8-5 lead.

Miami packed in its zone to cut off Wall and backcourt mate Eric Bledsoe from getting to the lane and didn't hesitate to lay a body on Wall's slender 6-foot-4 frame. He was bumped nearly every time he got into traffic and received a rude welcome to college basketball while running on the fast break midway through the first half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- DeMarcus Cousins had 27 points and 18 rebounds to help No. 4 Kentucky outlast Sam Houston State 102-92 on Thursday night in the Cancun Challenge.

Patrick Patterson had 20 points and nine boards and John Wall added 21 points and six assists as the Wildcats (3-0) overcame a record-setting shooting performance by the Bearkats (2-1).

Sam Houston State (2-1) hung around deep into the second half behind stellar 3-point shooting, led by senior guard Corey Allmond, who poured in 37 points and made a Rupp Arena record 11 3-pointers. The Bearkats made 18 of 38 3-pointers and never let Kentucky get comfortable.

The Wildcats survived behind Cousins and Patterson, who had little trouble doing whatever they wanted against the shorter, smaller Bearkats. Kentucky outscored Sam Houston State 48-18 in the paint and held a 48-33 advantage on the boards while shooting 60 percent from the floor.

Still, it wasn't exactly the kind of crisp performance coach John Calipari was looking for after Kentucky narrowly escaped an upset bid by Miami (Ohio) on Monday.

Wall hit a last-second jumper to lift the Wildcats to victory against the RedHawks.

There were no such heroics necessary this time, but the joy felt during Wall's dynamic debut was replaced with a sense of unease as Kentucky allowed another opponent to go crazy from behind the arc.

Calipari called Miami's performance - the RedHawks made 15 of 26 3-pointers - somewhat of a fluke and said he was "ecstatic" after the Wildcats rallied from an 18-point deficit to win.

He wasn't quite so cheery when Kentucky failed to put away the Bearkats, a member of the Southland Conference.

The Wildcats never trailed, but the inability to slow down Allmond or get any production from the bench - Kentucky's reserves did not score a single point - left Calipari in a frenzy.

He called timeout after timeout hoping to get his team to play with some defensive intensity. It never happened.

Allmond simply wouldn't let it. He hardly seemed bothered while being guarded by Wall, considered the top freshman in the country. Allmond knocked down eight 3-pointers in the first half alone. Some of the shots were flat-out ridiculous, including a double-pump leaning 3-pointer with Wall all over him.

Kentucky still managed to lead 53-42 at the half then opened the second half on a 7-0 run to push the lead to 18. Yet they simply couldn't get free.

Sam Houston State pulled to 81-73 with 6:58 remaining before one last burst by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 94-77.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Freshman John Wall had 21 points and 11 assists as No. 4 Kentucky dominated Rider 92-63 on Saturday in the Cancun Challenge.

Patrick Patterson added 19 points and a career-high 18 rebounds for the Wildcats (4-0).

Kentucky held Rider (2-2) to 31 percent shooting, blocked 10 shots and forced the Broncos into 20 turnovers.

Ryan Thompson led Rider with 16 points, but the Broncos couldn't find the shooting stroke that helped them win at Mississippi State last week. Rider made just 4-of-17 3-pointers and was never really in it after Wall took over midway through the first half.

The Wildcats allowed 33 3-pointers in narrow escapes over the RedHawks and Barkats, wins that Calipari said showcased just how far his team has to go.

Kentucky appeared to take important strides against the Broncos, who came in knocking down 48 percent of its 3-pointers.

Kentucky extended its perimeter defense to prevent the kind of open looks that the RedHawks and Barkats so easily turned into points. Everyone got involved in stopping the 3. At one point 6-foot-11 center DeMarcus Cousins picked up a foul behind the 3-point line for challenging a shot.

Rider didn't make a 3-pointer until Brandon Penn knocked one down from the corner in the first minute of the second half, and by then the Broncos were trailing by 28. Even that wasn't easy, as Penn fell to the floor after UK center Daniel Orton came flying at him.

All the misses led to long rebounds, which allowed Wall to get out on the fast break and show the speed that has some NBA scouts predicting he'll be the top pick in next year's draft.

During one stretch in the first half he completed a flawless 360-degree spin in the lane for a layup and followed it up moments later with a steal, a basket and the foul.

The prettiest move, however, was a coast-to-coast sprint off a Rider miss in which Wall dribbled the ball between his legs at full speed while switching from his left hand to his right hand. He made the layup while absorbing the contact then knocked down the free-throw to put Kentucky 27-14 with 8:16 to go in the first half.

Cousins and fellow freshman center Daniel Orton combined for 32 points and 12 rebounds and Kentucky received plenty of production off the bench after the starters scored all 102 points in the win over Sam Houston State.

Kentucky led 51-26 at the break and never let Rider get within 20 points. UK outscored Rider in the paint 56-20 and had 24 second-chance points.

CANCUN, Mexico -- Once John Wall gained his footing, not even a warped court could slow down Kentucky.

The heralded freshman found his form in the second half and proved too much to handle in the open floor as the No. 5 Wildcats raced past Cleveland State 73-49 on Tuesday in the Cancun Challenge at the Moon Palace Resort.

Wall scored a team-high 15 points, including 11 after halftime, as he zipped in and out of the Cleveland State defense. The nation's top-rated recruit last year repeatedly took charge with the ball, drawing trips to the free-throw line or setting up teammates for open looks at the basket.

The game was played in unconventional surroundings, with the resort's main ballroom being converted into a makeshift gymnasium.

Chandeliers hung from the low ceiling, two electronic scoreboards were connected to the ceiling by wire cables, and a food buffet sat just a few feet off the end of one baseline. Sections of the hardwood floor had gaps several inches wide and the baseline was a jagged line where the floor did not match up.

The game was chippy and ragged from the start, with both teams talking trash and officials whistling 24 fouls in the first half. A late 3-pointer by 6-foot-10 forward Josh Harrellson stemmed a late Cleveland State run and gave Kentucky a 35-27 lead at the break.

Kentucky (5-0) took control early in the second half when freshman forward DeMarcus Cousins hit a 3 as the shot clock expired, then made five free throws on one possession, aided by an intentional foul called on D'Aundray Brown for grabbing Wall and pulling him to the floor on a breakaway.

By the time Cleveland State (3-2) called a timeout with 13:08 remaining, Kentucky had outscored the Vikings 18-4 in the second half to open a 22-point advantage.

Cousins was whistled for an technical foul for throwing an intentional elbow at Cleveland State's Jared Cunningham with 3:25 remaining after an official warned Cunningham for shoving Cousins in the back seconds earlier.

Kentucky won despite preseason All-American Patrick Patterson finishing with only nine points and five rebounds, both well below his season averages of 19 points and 12.3 rebounds. Patterson played only one minute in the second half but did not appear to have an injury.

Cleveland State was led by Brown's 10 points. Cousins added 14 points and seven rebounds for Kentucky.

CANCUN, Mexico -- Freshman sensation John Wall scored a season-best 23 points, including clutch shots in the final minute that sent the game to overtime, and No. 5 Kentucky closed with an eight-point run for a 73-65 victory over gritty Stanford on Wednesday night in the championship game of the Cancun Challenge at the Moon Palace Resort.

Playing his fifth college game, Wall capped a big night with a slam dunk at the final horn, setting off a wild celebration by Kentucky players before a crowd of 1,425.

Wall hit a 12-foot fadeaway jumper from the right wing to tie the score at 61 with 30.6 seconds remaining in regulation, then two free throws with 2.4 seconds left to send the game to overtime.

Fellow freshman Eric Bledsoe made an NBA-length 3-pointer with 33 seconds to go that gave Kentucky a 69-65 lead it did not relinquish.

Stanford's Landry Fields was fouled by Ramon Harris during a scramble and hit both ends of a 1-and-1 to give Stanford a 63-61 lead with 28.2 seconds on the clock.

The Wildcats opted not to call a timeout and went to freshman forward DeMarcus Cousins, who was fouled on the block. The 53.6 percent free throw shooter missed the first free throw and then the second on purpose, but fouled Stanford's Jarrett Mann on the rebound.

Mann, a 53 percent free throw shooter, then missed both of his free-throw attempts, setting up a final flurry. Wall drew a blocking call on Andrew Zimmermann with 2.4 seconds left and calmly swished both free throws to tie it again.

Stanford's full-court pass was batted off the backboard by Patrick Patterson and corralled by Wall to send the game to overtime.

Wall was the only Kentucky player to get going before the break. The freshman had 15 points but could not do all the heavy lifting with preseason All-American forward Patterson going out of the game less than six minutes in with two fouls. Without Patterson's inside presence the Wildcats struggled to get anything in the paint and shot just 35.5 percent from the field.

Patterson got going early in the second half on his way to his 25th career double-double, but he missed two point-blank opportunities on the same possession that would have given Kentucky its first lead since late in the first half with just over 10 minutes left.

He made up for it later, using a power post move to give Kentucky a 54-53 lead with 6:42 to play.

It was only the third meeting between the schools and first since the 1998 NCAA tournament semifinals. Kentucky won that showdown 86-85 in overtime on its way to its seventh - and most recent - national championship.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. -- DeMarcus Cousins scored 24 points and grabbed 10 rebounds to lead No. 5 Kentucky to an easy 94-57 win over UNC-Asheville on Monday night.

John Wall added 12 points and a school freshman-record 14 assists, while Patrick Patterson had 17 points and nine boards as the Wildcats (7-0) cruised during their annual appearance at Freedom Hall.

Kentucky had little trouble getting out on the break, where Wall dazzled with a series of alley-oop passes to his teammates while adding a couple of highlight-reel dunks himself.

During a 29-6 burst midway through the 2nd half the Wildcats converted five straight dunks - all on alley-oop passes from Wall.

UK came in averaging 18.6 turnovers a game, a number coach John Calipari attributed to his team's inexperience as it learns his "dribble-drive" offense. The Wildcats gave it away just eight times against the Bulldogs while handing out 28 assists on 36 field goals.

Following a series of early season scares - including an overtime escape against Stanford in the Cancun Challenge finals last week - Kentucky played with the kind of dominance Calipari said would come as soon as his young squad started figuring things out.

The Wildcats certainly looked like they "got it" when Wall was on the floor. He looked for his teammates early and only tried to shoot when the opportunity was too good to pass up.

He kept feeding Cousins in the second half in an effort to help the freshman center shake off a somewhat lackluster performance in Mexico. Cousins had his way with the Bulldogs in the lane as Kentucky used its size to rebound UNC-Asheville 44-31. UK found plenty of easy looks to go around and connected on 52 pct.

The Bulldogs at least got off to a better start than they did against Tennessee, when they made just two field goals in the first half while falling behind the Volunteers by 52 at the break.

UNC-Asheville had 2 baskets by the first media timeout, though the Bulldogs were never really in danger of making it a game.

Wall did his best to provide a little entertainment for what figures to be his only game at Freedom Hall during his collegiate career.

He threw down a wicked reverse dunk on a break and followed it up moments later with another slam after a steal. UNC-Asheville's Primm didn't even bother chasing down the court, trotting once Wall got behind him as the Kentucky star swooped in for the jam.

Wall wasn't perfect, however, botching an alley-oop pass from Miller, one of the few miscues on a night when UK hardly worked up a significant sweat while matching their best start since 2004.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- John Wall bounced back from a bout with dehydration and a queasy encounter with an IV drip to finish with 16 points - including the clinching free throws with 4.3 seconds left - to lift the No. 5 Wildcats to a 68-66 victory over the 10th-ranked Tar Heels on Saturday.

Wall dominated at times while helping the Wildcats (8-0) build a 19-point first-half lead, then spent 20 anxious minutes in the training room after cramping up. It took a couple of bottles of Gatorade and a bit of teeth grinding by Wall to get back on the floor.

Kentucky inched closer to becoming the first program to reach 2,000 victories thanks to some clutch free throw shooting by Wall and fellow freshman Eric Bledsoe. The duo combined to make 5 of 6 in the final 30 seconds after the Tar Heels pulled within 63-61.

Consider North Carolina coach Roy Williams convinced, particularly after the Wildcats took control with an explosive 28-2 run in the first half.

"You've got to give them congratulations, they really kicked our butts," Williams said. "They just ran us out of the gym."

The Wildcats snapped a five-game losing streak to the Tar Heels. Forward Patrick Patterson provided some of the grit, finishing with 19 points and seven rebounds to help UK off to its best start since 1992-93, when the Wildcats won their first 11 games.

Deon Thompson led North Carolina with 14 points and Will Graves added 13.

After Thompson's jumper from the corner pulled North Carolina within 63-61, Bledsoe shook off several late-game miscues to knock down a pair of free throws. After Graves missed a 3-pointer and the rebound bounced out off bounds, Bledsoe made one of two to make it 66-61.

A tip-in by Thompson pulled Carolina to 66-63, but Wall finished his breakout performance by calmly sinking two free throws with 4.3 seconds left. Graves hit a meanless 3-pointer at the buzzer, and by then the Wildcats bench had poured onto the floor to celebrate.

Calipari said before the game he was anxious to see how his team responded when it got "punched in the mouth," and still refused to say college basketball's winningest program is back.

The win provided redemption of sorts for Wall, a native of Raleigh, N.C., who grew up wanting to play for the Tar Heels. Though North Carolina pursued him throughout high school, the Tar Heels never offered him a scholarship.

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- John Wall has played nine games for Kentucky. His latest was his best - and the end of this one showed the freshman guard is as good as advertised.

Wall scored a season-high 25 points, including 12 of his team's last 15, and the fourth-ranked Wildcats beat No. 14 Connecticut 64-61 on Wednesday night in the SEC/Big East Invitational.

What made Wall's performance in his first appearance in Madison Square Garden even more remarkable is that he was saddled with foul trouble in the first half before dominating the game over the final 7 1/2 minutes - even when Connecticut made a defensive switch that slowed him down for a few possessions.

The Wildcats (9-0) moved John Calipari closer to one of the icons at the school that has more wins (1,997) than any other program. The only coach to have a better start to his career at Kentucky was Adolph Rupp, who started 10-0 in 1931.

Jerome Dyson had 17 points for the Huskies (6-2), who finished 14-24 from the free throw line, including 2-4 in the final 3 minutes.

After a first half of runs and big swings, neither team had a lead of more than five points over the final 7 minutes.

Wall's three-point play on a breakaway dunk gave the Wildcats a 54-47 lead with 7:16 left. Stanley Robinson, Connecticut's sky-walking forward, finally became a factor for the Huskies, scoring six straight points. When Gavin Edwards scored on a break dunk with 4:24 to play, Connecticut was within 56-55 with 4:24 to go.

Walker, who had 12 points and six assists, gave the Huskies their final lead of the game on a jumper with 1:12 left.

Wall, who was slowed a bit when Calhoun switched the 6-9 Robinson on him for five possessions, put Kentucky ahead for good on a three-point play when he was fouled hard as he drove to the basket - making it 63-61 with 30 seconds left.

Connecticut called two timeouts then went for the tie as Walker drove and there was a tip by the Huskies as well. But Walker was forced to foul on the rebound, and Ramon Harris made one of two free throws with 13 seconds left.

Edwards missed a forced 3-point attempt, and Walker couldn't get a shot off from the corner in time after corraling the rebound.

Patterson had 16 points for Kentucky, and DeMarcus Cousins added 10 points and 10 rebounds.

There were two totally different halves played in front of the crowd of 15,874, which seemed split down the middle.

Kentucky opened the game with a 12-0 run, and the Huskies scored the next 10 points as part of a run that gave them a 26-18 lead on a drive by Walker with 6:30 left. Connecticut led 29-23 at halftime.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- Indiana took its best shot at No. 4 Kentucky on Saturday. The Wildcats retaliated with a shrug and a knockout punch in a 90-73 victory.

John Wall got the offense in sync, setting up a decisive 18-0 second-half run that gave the Wildcats their first win in Bloomington since 1981. It was just what Kentucky coach John Calipari thought his team needed.

The Wildcats are 10-0, off to their best start since 1992-93, and Calipari has matched the best start for a first-year Kentucky coach since Adolph Rupp in 1930-31.

Kentucky moved within two wins of becoming the first Division I school with 2,000 all-time victories, and perhaps more importantly to Calipari, proved they could fight back when challenged.

Wall, the freshman with the mesmerizing moves, adapted by doing more of the dirty work Saturday. He finished with 11 points, eight below his average, eight assists and seven rebounds. Another freshman, Eric Bledsoe, led Kentucky with 23 points, including four 3-pointers, and junior forward Patrick Patterson was his usual self, scoring 19 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. It was Patterson's fifth double-double of the season.

Not surprisingly, the game between the border rivals came with some new twists. Though the fans fed the Hoosiers energy, the distractions couldn't prevent Kentucky from its eighth win in the last 10 meetings in the series. The teams have been playing on an annual basis but played 15 straight years on neutral courts in Indianapolis and Louisville before going to back to home courts in 2006.

Freshman Maurice Creek scored a season-high 31 points and hit five 3s for Indiana. Nobody else scored more than seven points, and IU was outrebounded 49-24 overall, 21-8 on the offensive end.

In fact, the Hoosiers led for the first half of the first half, right until Patterson missed the second of two free throws, Darius Miller grabbed the rebound and Bledsoe hit a 10-foot fallaway on the baseline to make it 21-19 with 9:33 left. The Wildcats then extended the lead to 38-30.

After Jeremiah Rivers made a nifty driving layup to give Indiana a 48-47 lead, Wall scored on an athletic alley-oop dunk. Kentucky then hit a 3 or converted three-point plays on four of their next five scoring possessions to make it 65-48.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Patrick Patterson scored 21 points, including nine during a decisive second-half run, and No. 3 Kentucky beat Austin Peay 90-69 on Saturday.

John Wall added 17 points and six assists while DeMarcus Cousins had 19 points and eight rebounds for the Wildcats (11-0), who moved within one victory of becoming the first college basketball program to reach 2,000.

Wesley Channels led the Gavs (7-5) with 21 points but Austin Peay couldn't keep up once Patterson got going. The junior forward took control during a 12-0 run midway through the second half that gave Kentucky an 82-61 lead.

The win pushed Kentucky coach John Calipari past Adolph Rupp in the school record book for the best start by a first-year head coach. Rupp won his first 10 games in 1931.

Austin Peay cut a 16-point deficit to 49-43 early in the second half on a play in which even Wall looked human. Wall got tangled up with Austin Peay's Caleb Anthony at midcourt, with Anthony coming out with the ball while Wall writhed on the ground in pain.

Wall rolled on the floor for a couple of anxious moments before limping to the bench. He returned a couple of minutes later, but was sent back to the bench after sustaining a cut over his left eye while driving to the basket. Trainers hastily put a bandage over Wall's eye and he appeared to have no problem with it.

Patterson started the run with a layup off a nice pass from Daniel Orton, then added the free throw after getting fouled. His two most spectacular points of the day came moments later thanks to a little bit of ad-libbing by Wall.

Eric Bledsoe was leading the Kentucky break when he hit a streaking Wall for what appeared to be an alley-oop. Wall had other ideas, touching the ball to Patterson for a dunk.

Patterson added a tip-in on Kentucky's next possession and Darnell Dodson followed with a 3-pointer to push it to 80-61 before Patterson capped the run with a pair of free throws.

The crowd stirred when Liggins made his way to the scorer's table 6 minutes in, then roared when he was introduced, perhaps a nod to Liggins' perseverance. Liggins didn't waste any time making an impact. He tipped in Wall's miss to give the Wildcats an 18-11 lead, then had a 3-pointer roll out moments later.

The boost helped Kentucky take a 49-35 halftime lead, and the Wildcats used their size to keep it intact. They outscored Austin Peay 44-16 in the paint, 26-16 on second-chance points and made all 18 free throws.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Kentucky's 2,000th victory looked awfully familiar. DeMarcus Cousins and Patrick Patterson scored 18 points apiece and the third-ranked Wildcats became the first team in NCAA history to reach the 2,000-win plateau with an 88-44 romp over Drexel on Monday night.

Kentucky improved to 2,000-635-1 in 107 seasons. North Carolina is next on the list with 1,992 wins while Kansas has 1,980.

"We weren't a part of many of those 2,000 wins and we had a job to do and that was drag us across the line before that other blue team got there," coach John Calipari said. "This is a special moment for this program and this state."

Samme Givens led Drexel (6-6) with 11 points, but the Dragons shot just 31 percent from the field and spent most of the game as invited guests to Kentucky's celebration.

The first win was an 11-10 squeaker over the Lexington YMCA on Feb. 18, 1903. It took Kentucky 66 years to reach 1,000 victories. Students celebrated the milestone with cake alongside legendary coach Adolph Rupp at Memorial Coliseum in 1969.

This party was a little bigger. Confetti showered the court moments after the final buzzer while players donned black T-shirts commemorating the occasion.

The Wildcats needed just 40 years to reach the next millennium, a ride that included three national titles and a recruiting scandal under former coach Eddie Sutton.

The program was revived under Rick Pitino during the 1990s, and for the last few years Kentucky's march toward 2,000 seemed to be a foregone conclusion.

Before a crowd that included Gov. Steve Beshear, former coach Joe B. Hall and program luminaries like Kenny Walker and Jamal Mashburn, Kentucky dominated from the opening tip.

The Wildcats shot 53 pct, outrebounded Drexel 45-22 and didn't let up until the lead neared 50 midway through the second half.

Wall did a little bit of everything, finding Cousins for open baskets early as the Wildcats raced to a quick 15-3 lead, then showing his breathtaking ability in the open court as Kentucky pulled away.

He scored the last six points of the half, all with a relatively high degree of difficulty, including one in which he wrapped the ball behind his back from his left hand to his right hand at full speed before putting it in off the glass.

The Wildcats led 56-20 at the break. When Patterson opened the second half with a 3-pointer, the crowd started holding up signs like "UK2K" and counting the minutes until the program's spot in the history books was secure.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Kentucky coach John Calipari knew the hangover was coming. And he knew he couldn't stop it.

So rather than yell and scream after the third-ranked Wildcats slogged through the first 20 minutes against Long Beach State on Wednesday, less than 48 hours after celebrating the program's 2,000th win, Calipari simply challenged his players to shake it off.

The Wildcats took control late for a gritty if not exactly pretty 86-73 win, wearing down the 49ers in the second half to continue the program's best start in more than 30 years.

"We were able to grind it out, execute it to a T down the stretch," Calipari said.

The Wildcats (13-0) had to after the 49ers kept hanging around. Long Beach State (6-6) pulled within 58-55 with just over 11 minutes remaining before Kentucky finally asserted itself behind freshman stars John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins.

Wall finished with 19 points while Cousins shook off early foul trouble to score 15 points and grab 10 rebounds in his sixth double-double of the season.

Cousins played just over two minutes in the first half after getting a personal foul and a technical foul after getting tangled up with Long Beach's Larry Anderson.

Cousins spent the rest of the half watching from the bench, and was soon joined by Wall and junior forward Patrick Patterson.

Even when the trio returned to start the second half, it took time for Kentucky to assume control. Long Beach even took the lead 46-44 on a putback by T.J. Robinson before the Wildcats started to wake up.

Eric Bledsoe, playing on a sore ankle, hit a 3-pointer to put Kentucky ahead, and Wall followed with a couple of free throws. The 49ers rallied to tie it at 51 before Kentucky's defense started to wear on them. Long Beach was playing its second game in just over 36 hours, having taken the redeye on Monday night following an 85-80 overtime loss to Loyola Marymount.

Long Beach went to a zone in hopes of saving its legs, but Wall exploited it for a 3-pointer that put Kentucky up 73-62, and Cousins followed with a layup. Darius Miller knocked down an open 3 to make it 78-64 and the Wildcats were finally in the clear.

Patterson added 15 points and 11 rebounds while Bledsoe finished with 11 points and five assists. Anderson and Stephan Gilling led Long Beach with 15 points each while Robinson had 13 points and 15 rebounds for the 49ers.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Freshman point guard John Wall set a school record with 16 assists and No. 3 Kentucky crushed Hartford 104-61 on Tuesday night.

Wall added nine points and four rebounds as the Wildcats matched their best start in 32 seasons.

Wall broke the record of 15 assists, set by Travis Ford against Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 8, 1993, on a pass to Perry Stevenson that put Kentucky up 97-56.

The Wildcats shot 60 percent from the field and made 14 3-pointers. Darnell Dodson scored a season-high 19 points for Kentucky while DeMarcus Cousins posted his third straight double-double with 19 points and 12 boards.

Joe Zeglinski led Hartford (2-10) with 19 points and Milton Burton added 18.

The Hawks, who hadn't played in 18 days, were simply over-matched from the opening tip and spent most of the game as bystanders as Wall went to work.

Hartford managed to hang around briefly before Kentucky hit the gas pedal with a dizzying 18-2 run that featured plenty of high-light-ready plays.

Cousins started the run with a dunk off an alley-oop from Wall. Dodson followed with a 3-pointer and after Cousins hit two free throws things really got out of hand. Kentucky's next four field goals all came on dunks, three of them on alley-oops.

The most spectacular came courtesy of Wall, who took a feed from Darius Miller, plucked the ball out of midair and twisted his body for a reverse dunk that brought the sellout crowd to his feet.

Kentucky roared to the half up 57-31 and the only drama over the final 20 minutes was Wall's pursuit of the assist record.

He didn't disappoint. He drew within one before Kentucky coach John Calipari took him out with about 12 minutes to go. He returned with 7:53 remaining, tied Ford's record on a basket by Josh Harrellson then broke it a few moments later when he found Stevenson at the top of the key.

The crowd erupted as Stevenson's jumper splashed through the net. Wall received a standing ovation as he made his way to the bench at the next timeout while the student section chanted his name.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- DeMarcus Cousins scored 18 points and matched a season-high with 18 rebounds to lead No. 3 Kentucky past rival Louisville 71-62 on Saturday.

Patrick Patterson and John Wall added 17 points each for the Wildcats (15-0), who matched their best start in 40 years by breaking a two-game losing streak to the Cardinals.

Edgar Sosa and Jerry Smith led Louisville (10-4) with 11 points apiece but the Cardinals shot just 32 percent and couldn't contain Wall when it mattered.

The freshman star shook off a slow start by scoring six straight points during a decisive 14-3 run late in the second half after the Cardinals had surged to the lead.

He hit a tough leaver along the baseline to put Kentucky back in front then added a pull-up jumper to extend the lead to three. He stripped the ball from Louisville's Peyton Siva and knocked down a pair of free throws after being fouled trying to finish on the break.

Perry Stevenson added a reverse layup, Ramon Harris drilled a 3-pointer and Patrick Patterson converted a three-point play to give Kentucky a 55-45 lead with 5:35 to go.

The teams combined for 51 personal fouls - including five technicals - and 37 turnovers in a game that made up for in passion what it lacked in precise play.

The Wildcats were whistled for a pair of fouls on Louisville's first possession, the calls kick starting a series of trash talking shoving matches that kept the referees busy.

Things grew more heated moments later when Cousins and Louisville forward Jared Swopshire got tangled up battling for a loose ball. Louisville's Reginald Delk came over and gave Cousins a push while Swopshire tried to wiggle free. All three players received technical fouls for unsportsmanlike conduct.

Cousins stayed in the game long enough to score Kentucky's first six points as the Wildcats swarmed the shaky Cardinals into bad shots and turnovers.

Louisville missed 18 of its first 19 shots and looked overwhelmed by the electric atmosphere.

Kentucky led just 27-19 at the break before Louisville briefly got into a rhythm behind Sosa and Smith. Yet it wasn't enough as the smaller Cardinals wore down over the final 7 minutes against the tallest team in the country.

The Wildcats outscored Louisville 40-24 in the paint, with Cousins dominating his matchup with Louisville center Samardo Samuels. Samuels finished with nine points and nine rebounds, turned it over three times and was muscled out of the way by Cousins.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- No. 3 Kentucky needed its Freshman center, DeMarcus Cousins to hold off Georgia Saturday.

Cousins scored seven of his 16 points in the final 3 minutes as the Wildcats stayed unbeaten with a gritty 76-68 win over the Bulldogs on Saturday.

Cousins kept his emotions in check against Georgia, staying under control despite spending most of his 25 minutes on the floor wrestling underneath the basket with the handful of Bulldogs charged with stopping him.

Calipari rewarded Cousins' newfound maturity with the ball.

The Wildcats fed it to him constantly over the final minutes, and he responded by scoring seven straight points, including the game-clinching lay-up with 36 seconds left.

So was Patrick Patterson, who finished with 17 points. Freshman superstar John Wall also had 17 for the Wildcats, who moved to 16-0 for the first time since winning their first 23 games in 1965-66.

It wasn't easy. There were 12 lead changes and nine ties as Georgia hung around despite turning it over 26 times against Kentucky's unrelenting press.

The Bulldogs (8-6, 0-1 SEC) nearly pulled off their second straight upset behind a season-high 20 points from Travis Leslie and 17 points and 13 rebounds from Trey Thompkins.

Georgia knocked off No. 20 Georgia Tech on Tuesday, but couldn't duplicate the feat against the Wildcats. Kentucky wore the Bulldogs down over the final 6 minutes, limiting them to six points and forcing six turnovers.

Kentucky wasn't much better. The Wildcats made just 2 of 14 3-point attempts for the second straight game, and Calipari criticized a lack of production from his bench. Kentucky's reserves had just nine points.

Cousins' heroics didn't appear to be necessary early. The Wildcats quickly built an 11-point lead and appeared to be on cruise control in front of a capacity crowd that included movie star Ashley Judd and Pittsburgh Steelers coach Mike Tomlin.

Georgia, however, didn't back down. Borrowing a page from Louisville, the Bulldogs opted to get physical with the Wildcats. Georgia bumped, grabbed and nudged Wall wherever he went.

The Bulldogs did the same to Cousins, as Albert Jackson, Chris Barnes and Jeremy Price all fouled out trying to keep the Wildcats in check.

The win was the 62nd straight conference victory for Calipari. The first 61 game while he was helping Memphis run roughshod over the Conference USA.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. -- Attention, SEC. Kentucky has a freshman point guard capable of beating teams in a variety of ways.

And it's not John Wall. Eric Bledsoe scored a career-high 25 points, getting to the rim, hitting 3-pointers and making just about everything in between to help the second-ranked Wildcats stay unbeaten with an 89-77 victory over Florida on Tuesday night.

Wall was no slouch, either. He finished with 19 points despite missing six of seven from 3-point range. Patrick Patterson added 15 points and seven rebounds for the Wildcats (17-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference), who ended the game with a 17-5 run and snapped a five-game losing streak in Gainesville.

Erving Walker led Florida with 20 points, and Alex Tyus added 17. But the Gators (11-5, 0-2) are off to their worst start in conference play since '96--the year before coach Billy Donovan took over.

Kentucky built a 55-40 lead, but couldn't close it out--something that's starting to become a trend for coach John Calipari's team.

Kentucky watched a double-digit lead slip away Saturday against Georgia. This time, Walker did most of the damage. He hit two 3-pointers and two free throws, then Kenny Boynton got loose on a fast break that whittled Kentucky's lead to 61-54 with about 12 minutes to play. Clearly feeling it, Walker hit two more 3s--on consecutive possessions--a few minutes later. Vernon Macklin rattled home a layup that made it 68-66 with 7:59 remaining.

UF tied the game at 72 on Macklin's putback with 5:13 left.

Patterson put the Cats back ahead with a turnaround jumper in the lane. He failed to convert the three-point play, but DeMarcus Cousins gathered the rebound. Darnell Dodson then hit a 3. Bledsoe added to the pain with another 3 on the next possession that put Kentucky ahead 80-73 with 3:58 to play.

Kentucky shot 51 percent from the field and made 7 of 18 from 3-point range. Florida was much less effective. Donovan's squad shot 38 percent from the floor and hit 8 of 27 from behind the arc. The Gators struggled even more on the defensive end.

Bledsoe, Wall and Patterson proved to be the toughest matchups. Bledsoe was 10 of 13 shooting and added seven rebounds and five assists. Wall torched the Gators on the break and finished with six assists. Patterson was 7 of 11 shooting and had seven boards.

Kentucky dominated the first half after Florida scored the first seven points. Macklin dropped in a hook shot in the lane, Boynton made a layup and then Tyus drained the first 3-pointer of his career. It was all Kentucky the rest of the way.

The Wildcats scored at will in the paint, were bigger and faster on the perimeter, and would have had a double-digit lead if not for a few improbable shots from the Gators. Tyus, who had taken just one 3 in his first 87 college games, hit another one from behind the arc and then Boynton banked in a 3.

AUBURN, Ala. -- John Wall and No. 2 Kentucky were making youthful mistakes, and taking another team's best shot.

Wall hit two free throws with 8.9 seconds left to finish off a sometimes shaky performance and help Kentucky remain unbeaten with a 72-67 victory over Auburn on Saturday.

The Wildcats (18-0, 3-0 SEC) had a 13-point halftime lead wiped out and Wall, the heralded freshman, had six second-half turnovers. But Wall's clutch foul shots secured Calipari's 52nd consecutive victory in a regular-season conference game at Memphis and Kentucky, breaking UK legend Adolph Rupp's NCAA record.

DeWayne Reed cut Kentucky's lead to 70-67 with two free throws with 1:08 left, then Eric Bledsoe missed an open 3-pointer and the ball went out of bounds to Auburn with 37 seconds to play.

Reed missed a 3 after taking a handoff from Lucas Hargrove, and UK's DeAndre Liggins grabbed the rebound and was fouled.

UK inbounded the ball to Wall, who was fouled and made the free throws that continued the program's best start in 44 years.

A game the youthful Wildcats led by 19 points late in the first half became about self-preservation.

The Wildcats had shut down Auburn after Frankie Sullivan's 3-pointer tied it at 60 with 8:23 left. The Tigers went 4 minutes without scoring as Kentucky used stingy defense to overcome some missed drives and turnovers.

DeMarcus Cousins, a native of Mobile, had 16 points, 11 rebounds and four blocked shots in his first game back in his home state. He was 5 of 6 from the field and 6 of 10 from the line.

Wall finished with 13 points and four assists. He gave a slight smile after hitting his first free throw in the final seconds to make it a two-possession game, then calmly made his second.

Fellow freshman Eric Bledsoe, who is from Birmingham, also had 13 points, while Patterson finished with 12.

Reed led Auburn with 19 points and six assists despite missing his first 10 shots. He kept firing away, taking 25 shots and making seven. Sullivan made 3 of 5 3-point attempts and scored 10 of his 15 points in the second half. Lucas Hargrove added 10 points.

Auburn has lost 11 straight games against top 10 teams, including two in three days. The Tigers were routed 81-55 Thursday night at No. 9 Tennessee, but followed with a much stronger showing.

It was another close call for Kentucky, the fifth time the Wildcats have won either by five points or less or in overtime.

Kentucky committed 16 turnovers but shot 51 percent and capitalized at the free throw line. UK made 23 of 35 free throws.

All but eight came in the first half, when Kentucky built a 39-26 lead. Auburn shot 29 percent in the half and was out rebounded 27-14. Auburn bounced back to hit 16 of 29 shots in the second half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- John Wall raised his arms, waited for the long pass from teammate Eric Bledsoe then rose up for a dunk.

The heralded Kentucky freshman screamed as he landed, then added a sly little smile before racing back on defense.

Turns out all Wall needed to break out of his funk was a couple of dunks and perhaps his best all-around game in weeks.

Wall finished with 17 points and seven assists in 36 steady minutes to lead the fourth-ranked Wildcats to an 85-75 victory over No. 25 Mississippi on Tuesday night.

DeMarcus Cousins posted his fifth straight double-double with 18 points and 13 rebounds, Darnell Dodson added 14 points and Patrick Patterson had 12 points and six boards for the Wildcats.

It was certainly better than he's shown in recent weeks. After a scintillating start to the season in which he became a media darling, Wall's numbers have tailed off recently.

He came in averaging 16.2 points on 39 percent shooting in SEC play, hardly terrible but not exactly up to the ridiculously high standards Wall had set for himself.

Wall wasn't perfect against the Rebels, turning it over four times, but he showed a knack for controlling the tempo. He pushed the pace when necessary but also smartly backed off the throttle when the situation called for it.

Terrico White led Mississippi with 19 points and Chris Warren added 15 but the Rebels missed freshman big man Reginald Buckner, who sat out his 2nd straight game with a sprained ankle.

Mississippi certainly could have used Buckner's presence. Kentucky shot 50 percent from the field and outscored the Rebels 44-30 in the paint.

Kentucky used an early 15-0 burst to build a 27-9 lead. Mississippi recovered behind White and Eniel Polynice, pulling within 46-37 at halftime. Calipari felt the lead should have been larger, but 11 turnovers allowed the Rebels to hang around.

Dodson hit two 3-pointers early in the second half to help UK extend the lead to 58-41, though Mississippi managed one last burst, pulling within 60-57 on a basket by White with 13:55 to play.

Cousins started Kentucky's game-clinching 11-2 run with a put-back. Darius Miller then knocked down a 3-pointer before Cousins took a charge. Patterson nailed a 3-pointer then added a three-point play as the Wildcats went back in front 71-59.

Ole Miss never got back within single digits, and Wall capped his night with a three to put Kentucky up 80-62 with 4:05 remaining.

He walked off the court to a standing ovation, and received another one when he came back onto the court for a postgame radio appearance as the crowd exhaled with Kentucky's star apparently back in his coach's good graces.

Freshman DeMarcus Cousins had 19 points and 13 rebounds, his third straight double-double.

Cousins, who played only 20 minutes, is eighth in the country in doubles-doubles with 14 and 24th in the nation in rebounding.

Cousins said they were hard earned against LSU.

The Wildcats (22-1, 7-1 Southeastern Conference) ended the early drought when John Wall, another freshman star, hit a jumper for their first field goal. They needed only 3 minutes to erase LSU's lead, scoring 41 of the next 49 points to take a 42-14 halftime lead.

Patrick Patterson had 16 points for Kentucky and Eric Bledsoe, the third freshman starter, added 10. The Tigers limited Wall to a season-low six points on 2-of-9 shooting. It marked only the second time that Wall failed to reach double figures this season.

"The guys on Kentucky's team are absolute animals, Cousins, Patterson, all of them are physical," LSU guard Bo Spencer said. "They are big and wide, they're hard to get around."

LSU (9-14, 0-9) shot less than 19 percent from the field in the first half and finished at 26.7 percent overall (21 of 66).

Spencer led LSU with 25 points, 19 in the second half, but he had seven turnovers. Tasmin Mitchell added 10 points.

The margin of defeat matched LSU's biggest of the season. LSU lost to Connecticut by the same score in the NIT Season Tipoff in November.

LSU, which won the conference last season, is still searching for its first league victory in this one.

The Tigers played scrappy defense, but had a hard time slowing down the much bigger and faster Wildcats, who average 82.4 points a game. Kentucky outscored LSU 34-14 in the paint and allowed the Tigers no second-chance or fast-break points.

Kentucky outrebounded LSU 53-31

UK led by as many as 33 points, taking control and allowing Calipari to play most of his bench, which provided 22 points.

"Kentucky is a really great team," Mitchell said. "They've got everything they need and they play hard. I don't see why they aren't No. 1 in the country."

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- It was an historic night of scoring and rebounding for John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins, but most of the discussion after the game was about what Kentucky's two freshman phenoms did wrong in yet another easy victory for the third-ranked Wildcats.

Wall had 22 points and 10 rebounds for his third double-double and Cousins got his seventh straight - best by a UK player in 37 years - as the Wildcats outmuscled Alabama 66-55 on Tuesday.

Although Wall lit up the scoreboard at the end, the game started ugly for him. While he came in ranked second in the country in assists, he only managed two in this game - both in the second half. By then, he had racked up six turnovers - many of them sloppy ones - forcing Calipari at one point to take him out.

With 16 points and 13 rebounds, Cousins extended his UK freshman record with 15 double-doubles. The last Kentucky player to get seven in a row was Jim Andrews, who had a team-record 10 straight in 1973.

Five of Cousins' rebounds were on the offensive end, while all of Wall's career-high 10 were on defense. Still, there were problems there as well as his teammates seldom found him open in the middle early - a halftime adjustment Calipari made with success.

With the victory, Kentucky (23-1, 8-1) remained in first place in the Southeastern Conference East Division, one game ahead of Vanderbilt, which beat Tennessee on Tuesday.

Tony Mitchell had 13 points for Alabama (13-11, 3-7).

Alabama chipped away at the lead and cut it to 51-45 with 8 minutes left on a jumper by JaMychal Green. The Tide matched that six-point deficit with under a minute left on Anthony Brock's 3-pointer but got no closer as two free throws by Wall and a dunk by Patrick Patterson helped seal the victory for the Wildcats.

Early on, every shot taken by a UK player seemed to come closely guarded by one, two or three Alabama defenders.

Nobody adjusted more than Wall, who despite his turnovers gave the Wildcats a scoring boost, especially in the first half when they needed it most. Other than a wide-open 3 that gave Kentucky its first lead at 15-13, the rest of Wall's first-half points came under tight pressure from the stingy Alabama defense.

With Alabama up 11-4 early, Kentucky scored 13 of the next 15 points. The Wildcats took the lead for good with 5:45 before halftime on Patterson's dunk off a steal by Bledsoe. Patterson added a 3-pointer seconds before halftime - just Kentucky's second in 11 first-half attempts - to give Kentucky a 31-24 lead.

Alabama made 9 of 10 free throws in the game, but didn't manage their first until the second half. Kentucky, meanwhile connected on just 61 percent from the line, going 19 for 31.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- After missing two 3-point attempts in the first half, Kentucky freshman Eric Bledsoe told coach John Calipari he had lost confidence in his shot. Calipari's message, to Bledsoe's surprise: Keep shooting, anyway.

Bledsoe's second half resurgence, along with yet another stellar performance by fellow freshman guard John Wall, helped No. 3 UK fight off No. 12 Tennessee for a 73-62 victory Saturday night.

Down 52-50 midway through the second half after a three-point play by J.P. Prince, Kentucky (24-1, 9-1) scored the next 10 points - six of them by Wall - to give Calipari his first win over Bruce Pearl in their first Southeastern Conference matchup. The two met annually when Calipari coached at Memphis.

Wall was the game's leading scorer with 24, one off his career high set earlier this season against UConn. However, Wall acknowledged the true star of the game was Bledsoe, who got all 16 of his points in the second half and clinched the victory with three clutch shots in a row: a fastbreak layup followed by two 3-pointers.

Bledsoe credits a halftime chat with Calipari, who told him to keep shooting even if he misses. In the second half, though, they didn't have to. UK's backcourt led a 20-4 run that buried the Vols.

Bobby Maze led the Vols (18-6, 6-4) with 15 points. Melvin Goins had a career-high 14.

Although the Wildcats pulled away at the end, the two teams battled for the lead most of the night. Kentucky kept the Vols in it partly due to poor free throw shooting, particularly by DeMarcus Cousins, who connected on just one of eight attempts.

Cousins, who was going for an eighth consecutive double-double, managed 12 rebounds but scored only five points. The Kentucky record remains 10 straight, set by Jim Andrews in 1973.

Tennessee center Wayne Chism didn't start but made an immediate impact when he entered less than four minutes in. He nailed a 3-pointer on his first touch, then added a reverse layup to ignite 12-1 Tennessee run.

While the Vols got their big man back, the Wildcats briefly lost theirs during the Tennessee scoring stretch. Cousins, who had barreled into the media table during a play underneath the basket, was sidelined for 2 minutes with an apparent injury to his left hip.

Cousins was healthy enough a few minutes later to turn in one of the highlight plays of the game. After DeAndre Liggins missed a long jumper, Prince seemed to have both hands on the ball for an easy rebound. But Cousins robbed him in mid air, dunking it back into the hoop to give the Wildcats their biggest early lead at 20-14.

Although Chism's ankle held up fine, he was sidelined with a lower back bruise late in the first half after committing a hard foul. He was back on the court for the start of the second half but got only two of his 12 points after intermission.

STARKVILLE, Miss. -- John Wall scored 18 points, including five in overtime, and came within two assists of a triple-double to lead No. 2 Kentucky to an 81-75 victory over Mississippi State.

Wall's three-point play opened the scoring in overtime, then he added two free throws and blocked Dee Bost's layup attempt with 36 seconds left to push UK (25-1, 10-1) to their sixth straight win and snap a 3-game losing streak to the Bulldogs (18-8, 6-5).

DeMarcus Cousins and Patrick Patterson both scored 19 points. Wall had 10 rebounds and eight assists. Cousins had 14 rebounds.

UK trailed 67-60 with 3 minutes left, but scored the final seven points of regulation, the last two on Patterson's 15-foot jumper.

Bost scored 22 points for Mississippi State, which was without suspended leading scorer Ravern Johnson.

The final minute of the game was marred when fans in the student section of a the record crowd of 10,788 threw bottles onto the court, almost hitting official Mike Kitts and coming close to Wall as he stood near the Kentucky bench.

Mississippi State used a 13-2 run to take its biggest lead, 67-60, with 3 minutes left. Jarvis Varnado, one of the nation's leading shot blockers, fouled out midway through the run at 5:08, but that didn't seem to slow down the Bulldogs. They outscored the Wildcats 6-2 over the next 2 minutes before UK clamped down.

Eric Bledsoe hit a 3-pointer, then converted Cousins' block of Romero Osby into a layup before Patterson tied it at 72.

Mississippi State's Barry Stewart missed the rim on a 3-point attempt as the shot clock expired with 6.2 seconds left and DeAndre Liggins' jump shot from the baseline as time expired bounced off the rim.

Cousins, playing with four fouls, grabbed one of his seven offensive rebounds and hit a putback to give Kentucky a 72-70 lead with 3:02 left, but Osby answered with a leaping layup.

From there Wall took over. He wasn't a huge factor in the second half, but he was the difference in overtime. He beat Stewart for the three-point play, then hit one of two free throws in two trips to the line to give UK a 78-75 lead and enough cushion for the win.

Bost had a chance at a layup to cut the lead to one, but he lost the ball in traffic.

Mississippi State dropped to 0-7 against No. 2-ranked teams and 2-15 against top five teams under coach Rick Stansbury, who was denied his 250th career victory.

The Bulldogs were vulnerable without Varnado, who picked up his third and fourth fouls in a 5-sec span early in the second half. That left Stansbury with no option but to go with a smaller lineup.

Cousins thrived with Varnado out, scoring 12 points and grabbing nine rebounds after halftime. He pushed his SEC-leading double-double mark to 16, snapping a tie with Varnado, who had just five points, three rebounds and two blocks.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- John Wall sank a pair of free throws with 20 seconds left and had a big blocked shot to send No. 2 Kentucky to a 58-56 win over No. 17 Vanderbilt on Saturday night.

Kentucky (26-1, 11-1 SEC), which beat Vanderbilt 85-72 on Jan. 30, grabbed a two-game lead over the Commodores in the SEC East and dealt them their first home loss this season. It was the first time the Wildcats swept the regular season series since 2005.

Wall's free throws gave the Wildcats a 57-53 lead, but John Jenkins answered with a 3-pointer to pull Vanderbilt (20-6, 9-3) within a point.

Kentucky's Eric Bledsoe missed a pair of free throws, but Wall responded by blocking a 3-pointer by Jenkins on the other end and grabbing the ball.

He made one of two free throws for a two-point lead with 2.5 seconds to play, and the Commodores had one more chance.

A.J. Ogilvy caught a long in-bounds pass by Darshawn McClellan, but his runner in the lane bounced off the rim at the buzzer.

Cousins led Kentucky with 19 points and Patrick Patterson chipped in 13.

Taylor scored 17 points for Vanderbilt, which was a woeful 2 for 20 from 3-point range.

The Wildcats relied on their power in the paint, but the Commodores never let them get too comfortable.

Festus Ezeli and Steve Tchiengang both fouled out with more than 5 minutes remaining trying to disrupt Cousins and Patterson inside. Ogilvy picked up his fourth foul with 10:11 left.

Vanderbilt, the SEC's most prolific free-throw shooting team, used free throws to keep up with the Wildcats, and a pair by Taylor with 6:08 to go gave the Commodores a 49-45 lead, their largest of the game.

It didn't last long. Thanks to some free throws by Cousins, a layup by Bledsoe and a 3-pointer by Patterson, Kentucky scored the next eight points to grab a 53-49 lead with 2:57 left.

The Commodores made a few costly mistakes on defense that gave Kentucky some easy points. The Wildcats turned Vanderbilt's 15 turnovers into 19 points.

It was Kentucky's second close call in as many games after pulling out an 81-75 overtime win at Mississippi State on Tuesday.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Patrick Patterson agonized for a month over the one blemish on No. 2 Kentucky's otherwise perfect season - a loss to South Carolina on a night when he had just five points, his worst outing by far.

Determined not to repeat it in Thursday night's rematch with the Gamecocks, Patterson responded with a season-high 23 points - many of them in the clutch - and UK coasted to an 82-61 victory.

Like its last meeting with Kentucky a month ago, South Carolina (14-13, 5-8) proved a pesky opponent at times. However, Kentucky had too much offensive firepower, going on a late 13-0 run that turned what was then a 10-point lead into a blowout.

South Carolina never led, and every time it started to chip away, UK had an answer and usually it was from Patterson. He scored the first points of the game on a 3-pointer and didn't slow down.

Kentucky had a 15-point lead early in the second half, but twice Patterson responded when the Gamecocks cut it to six - first with a dunk, then a three-point play. South Carolina got no closer.

Sam Muldrow's dunk midway through the first half cut the early Kentucky lead to 23-21, but the Gamecocks would score just five more points before halftime. Three came on a long heave from Downey at the buzzer that made it 37-26.

Other than that, Kentucky closed the half on a 14-2 run, punctuated by a putback from DeAndre Liggins off a miss by Wall and a bank shot by Bledsoe.

Downey, who scored 30 points in the previous meeting in Columbia, shot for an even higher percentage in this one, going 9 of 25, but the team made fewer than 40 percent of its shots and only four of 20 3-point attempts.

Cousins had 19 points and 11 rebounds to increase his UK freshman record for double-doubles to 17. He also set a UK freshman record with his 285th rebound this season.

Then came Kentucky's nightly showstopper, Wall, who grabbed a steal and sprinted the other way, finishing with a reverse layup, not even looking at the basket in the process.

Those plays gave Kentucky an early 11-2 lead. South Carolina cut it to 16-15 after consecutive baskets by Downey and a reverse layup by Lakeem Jackson, but Kentucky got some cushion in a hurry thanks to Cousins.

There was no such hoopla around this one, although Hall of Famer Magic Johnson was among those in attendance and he heard roars from the Rupp Arena crowd when he was introduced.

South Carolina coach Darrin Horn said he certainly noticed improvement in the Wildcats from the last meeting.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- J.P. Prince and his Tennessee teammates watched No. 2 Kentucky erase a 19-point lead and knew they might also be watching a shot at a second major upset slip away.

But, the Vols' senior leader wouldn't let that happen. With 90 seconds left, he scored on a broken play and added four clutch free throws down the stretch to lift No. 19 Tennessee past the surging Wildcats 74-65 on Saturday.

No, in fact the Vols (21-7, 9-5 Southeastern Conference) seem to be growing accustomed to knocking off the giants of college basketball this year. Last month, they also handed top-ranked Kansas its only loss.

The Wildcats (27-2, 12-2), who had won eight in a row since their only other loss last month to South Carolina, had trailed by 19 early in the second half but managed to tie the game at 65 with just over two minutes left.

That's when Prince went to work, scoring six of his 20 points in the final 90 seconds. Add in a 3-pointer by Scotty Hopson - his only one in six attempts - and the Vols finished with nine straight points to ice it. Hopson had 15.

Tennessee coach Bruce Pearl said that Kentucky provided plenty of help in the upset. The Wildcats couldn't have been much colder from long range, connecting on just two of 22 attempts, contributing to season-worst 35 percent field goal shooting.

Kentucky coach John Calipari said, considering that, he was surprised the game was as close as it was.

The Wildcats got their usual solid games from freshman superstars John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins, but it wasn't enough.

Wall had 19 points, while Cousins added 15 points and 14 rebounds. Six of those points came on successive trips down the court as he made two free throws, then scored on two straight fast-break dunks, both off passes from Wall. That tied the game at 65 before the Vols pulled away at the end.

ATHENS, Ga. -- John Calipari waited until Wednesday morning's shootaround to remind his Kentucky players they were playing for more than a national championship.

Sensing they needed a lift, Calipari said he told his players, "Stop. Do you understand what we're playing for today?"

The answer was the Southeastern Conference championship. After the coach's reminder, No. 3 Kentucky clinched at least a share of the regular-season title by beating Georgia 80-68 on Wednesday night.

Calipari said the Wildcats were "sharp" and "focused" on the immediate goal.

John Wall had 24 points and Patrick Patterson added 17 points and 10 rebounds for the Wildcats, who scored the first 12 points of the second half and maintained control from there.

Kentucky (28-2, 13-2 SEC) bounced back from a loss at then-No. 19 Tennessee and moved one game ahead of Vanderbilt in the race for the league's best record. The Wildcats, who swept Vanderbilt, already own the tiebreaker and the top seed in the SEC tournament.

Before the shooting practice, all of Kentucky's focus had been on winning a No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament. Calipari said there had been no mention of the conference race.

Kentucky, which won a share of its 44th SEC title, snapped a streak of four straight home wins for Georgia (13-15, 5-10).

Wall hit three 3-pointers to help the Wildcats shake their recent shooting slump. The star freshman added six assists and three steals.

Calipari said he was happy with his team's second-half defense but still worried about its lack of consistency.

The Wildcats led 40-36 at halftime before turning up their defensive pressure in the opening minutes of the second half. Georgia, which had six turnovers in the first half, added six turnovers in the first three minutes of the second half.

Kentucky had eight steals and a season-high 14 blocks, including a career-high six by freshman DeMarcus Cousins.

Kentucky scored 24 points off Georgia's 15 turnovers. The defense also set up some easy fast-break baskets as the Wildcats shot 54.4 percent from the field, their high mark in the SEC this season.
